

What does it mean for Academic Advising?

What is CRP? (or CPR?)

- CRP is when a student has gone on Academic Suspension (typically after their 2nd or 3rd semester at the University, with a GPA below a 2.0, consecutively)
- An application through our office (Academic Support Programs)
- Readmitted by the Office of the Registrar
 - EDHE 202 and CRP Status on Account in SAP
- Required to take EDHE 202 the following semester (Fall or Spring, not Summer)

What does CRP mean?

- Student on Academic Suspension
- Developed for Federal Financial Aid Regulations and elimination of the "second Pell Grants" for summer enrollment
- CRP provides the alternative to the summer option
- Allows students to continue enrollment without disruption
- 12 to 16 hours
- Must make a semester GPA of at 2.20 to remove EDHE 202 for the following semester
 - At least a 2.0 or face Academic Dismissal (2.0 2.19, repeat 202 for the next semester)

The Application

- Located on our website, as a google doc.
- Takes about 10 to 15 minutes to fill out
- Asks about what has happened to get them on Suspension and what they plan to do to better their academics for the semester
- GPA and Transcript calculation (to get to a 2.0 and to a 2.20)
- Student acknowledges the information before submitting
- ASP processes the application (takes several days for this to happen)

Interview Process

- If GPA is below a 1.0, student will have to have an interview with one of ASP's Learning Specialists
 - Application is held in office until this is complete
 - Students are notified via email, text, and phone for the interview
 - Most interviews are 15 minutes with ASP going over the application and asking for more information on improvement
- If GPA is 1.0 to 1.99, ASP begins review of application to send to Registrar for petition for readmission

What it means for Advising?

- Students are asked if they have met with their advisor to develop a success plan
- A student's schedule is locked once the EDHE 202 status goes on their account and cannot make changes until they complete the CRP Application (Fall or Spring)
 - Cannot take Winter Intersession (class will be dropped by the Registrar)
 - If taking 12 hours in the Summer and makes below a 2.0, student will be dismissed (considered a term)
- Classes may have to be dropped or swapped to make sure schedule is complete and not going over the total hours (16 + /-), or under 12 hours
 - Once readmitted, the student is emailed (CRP status is added) and told to enroll in EDHE 202
 - Once EDHE 202 is on their schedule, they can make other changes to their schedule

Advising, cont.

- Students may contact advisors to assist them in adjusting their schedules so they do not face Academic Dismissal
 - May need to look at forgiveness options (retaking certain classes)
 - Being strategic in what is taken for the next semester (Fall or Spring not going over 16 hours or under 12)
- Typically 20+ sections of EDHE 202 offered each semester with 1 online for Regional Campus or students in ALL online classes
 - EDHE 202 is a 2-hour course
